#### **Zones of Regulation**


We will continue to link our community in about the learnings our students are participating in with the Zones of Regulation.

Since commencing our Zones of Regulation program, students are now able to:

- identify the four Zones of Regulation
- categorise their feelings into the four Zones
- give examples of situations that would put them into each of the Zones
- identify how people have different feelings and perspectives in a situation
- identify body signals for each of the Zones
- pause and do a Zones check-in by themselves or with others.











Bridge Activities for each of the four Concepts covered so far have been sent home with the eldest student in the family. These are a great way of students consolidating their learning and for families to learn the Zones language that students are learning at school.


Years F-2 'Double Act with a Big Impact'

Below are the procedures to follow on the night of the School Concert.



We realise there will be congestion in this process, but with patience, it can work for all to enjoy the students in their performances.

# (A) Families with Children in Foundation, Year 1 or Year 2 ONLY

- Drop Off Children in Years F-2 are taken to the 'Drop Off' door entrance located near the Box Office
  counter, to the 'Green Room' at 5:45pm. When dropping off children, PARENTS ARE NOT TO ENTER THE
  GREEN ROOM.
- Parents wait in foyer until seated in auditorium to view the F-2 performance.
   After students have finished their performances, they will return to the "Green Room" with their teacher/s and wait to be collected by their parents/guardians at the end of all the performances.
- Leave Auditorium At the conclusion of the F-2 performances, the auditorium <u>MUST</u> be completely
  emptied. Everyone will leave the auditorium to outside via the Nixon Street side of the auditorium.
- Re-entering Building Parents/guardians are to re-enter the venue at the front entrance on <u>Welsford</u>
   Street and go to the '<u>Pick up' door</u> to the 'Green Room' and collect their child. Please do <u>not pick up</u> at
   the doors near the kiosk as this is a very congested area.

#### (B) Families with Children in <u>BOTH PERFORMANCES</u> - F-2 and Years 3-6

- Drop Off Children in Years F-2 are taken to the 'Drop Off' door entrance located near the Box Office
  counter, to the 'Green Room' at 5:45pm. When dropping off children, PARENTS ARE NOT TO ENTER THE
  GREEN ROOM.
- Parents and siblings in Years 3 6 wait in foyer until seated in auditorium to view the F-2 performance.
   After F-2 students have finished their performances, they will return to the "Green Room" with their teacher/s and wait to be collected by their parents/guardians at the end of all the performances.
- Leave Auditorium At the conclusion of the F-2 performance, the auditorium MUST be completely
  emptied. Everyone will leave the auditorium to outside via the Nixon Street side of the auditorium.
- Re-entering Building Parents/guardians are to re-enter the venue at the front entrance on Welsford
  Street and go to the 'Pick up' door to the 'Green Room' and collect their child. Please do not pick up at
  the doors near the kiosk as this is a very congested area.
- Students in 3-6 who have been with their parent/guardian watching their sibling in F-2 perform, will then stay in the "Green Room".
- Collect F-2 child to watch year 3-6 performance: Parents/guardians who are collecting their child in F-2 from the "Green Room' and are about to re-enter the auditorium to watch the 3-6 performance, take their F-2 child and wait in the foyer.

# (C) Family with Children in Years 3, 4, 5 or 6 ONLY

- Drop Off Families who have come only to watch the Year 3-6 performance, will take their child directly
  to the 'Green Room' 'Drop off' door at 7:15pm then wait in the front foyer to be seated. When dropping
  off children, PARENTS ARE NOT TO ENTER THE GREEN ROOM.
- Pick Up At the conclusion of the year 3-6 performance, families are able to leave by the usual exits and collect their child/ren from the 'Green Room'.

#### They're Grand Champions. Again!

Agriculture students at Greater Shepparton Secondary College have won the prestigious 2025 Victorian Merino Wether Challenge for the second year in a row.

GSSC students again raised six sheep on campus over six months, applying animal husbandry skills to produce top-quality meat and wool. This year, 15 Victorian schools raised their own sheep sourced from the same stud to take on our reigning champions.

Ten handlers were selected to lead the GSSC flock of Shank, Lucifer, Chops, Rhino, Horny and Ethan in professional judging at Clunes last week. GSSC won first place for Carcase Value, second place for Fleece Value and second place for Best Presented to retain their Grand Champion status.

The annual Wether Challenge has been fully incorporated into Year 10 Agriculture studies, with learning benefits extending to Year 9 electives and Year 11 VCE pathways.

Innovation in Agriculture and Horticulture learning, led by teacher Charlotte Drinnan and championed by GSSC leadership, has seen enrolment double in these subjects over the past year – boding well for our region's booming agribusiness opportunities.



Scan to see competition

The Merino Wether Challenge is an initiative of the Australian Sheep Breeders Association and Australian Wool Innovation to promote careers in the sheep and wool industry. Long held in SA and NSW, the challenge was introduced to Victoria in 2024 – with GSSC making history ever since.


