Class structures for 2026

We will continue to provide one hour sessions of specialist subjects in Performing Arts, Physical Education, STEM and Visual Art. Staffing arrangements will be shared when finalised.

Transition to 2026 classes

Tuesday 9th December is statewide transition day. We have our 2026 Foundation students attending school 9am-1pm, which will be an exciting day for them. They will also meet their Year 6 buddy. Our current Year 6 students will spend the day at their secondary school. All other current students in Foundation to Year 5 will spend the entire day with their 2026 classroom teacher and group of future classmates. The aim of this transition day is to begin building relationships within the room and for students to be aware of who their new teacher will be. We have some staff joining us from other schools in 2026 and they will be at GPS for this day in the classrooms. Your child will find out their 2026 classroom teacher prior to this day in writing.

Teachers in each year are currently planning end of year activities that will take place between 8th-12th December. Some of these activities may take place out of school and some will happen on school grounds. Over the next couple of weeks, you will receive Compass notifications for consent & payment.
