Final assembly

GPS transition program

2026 pupil free days – Important dates for the calendar

The following dates have been approved by school council as pupil free days for next year. The purpose of each day will be explained in 2026 newsletters closer to the dates. The first date is when staff are required back to school after the holiday break. Students in Years 1-6 return on Wednesday 28th January, with our new Foundation students starting school on Thursday 29th January.

There is a possibility that there may be one more pupil free day added to this list, as each year teachers have a Professional Practice Day. This day has not been confirmed by the Education Department.

Kamsi– State Champion!!

Kamsi represented Grahamvale Primary School in the 9-10 year age group, at the School Sport Victoria - State Primary Track & Field Championships. This event took place at Lakeside Stadium in Melbourne on the 6th November.

Kamsi came first in the triple jump event with her best jump being 9.12metres, winning a gold medal!

She also came second in the 80 metres hurdles event with a time of 13.81secs (Personal Best time), winning a silver medal!

Congratulations also to Sophie Kemp who also competed at the State Athletics event in the 11 year old age group. Sophie competed in the discus event, with her best throw measuring 15.69m, placing her 16th in the state.



Student uniform

Please see the link below to our student dress code policy below. We are noticing an increase of students not wearing the full correct uniform recently. I know many families may look to purchase new items of clothing for school over the holiday break as students grow. I strongly recommend reading our student dress code prior to making purchases. I would like to particularly point out that no logos, such as 'Nike' or 'Adidas' etc. are to be visible on any of the bottom options. The only acceptable jewellery is a watch and one small plain stud or sleeper per ear.

At the beginning of 2026, if a student is not wearing full school uniform, they will receive a note from their classroom teacher to take home to their parents/carers. Get Devices Under Control – Our Children Need Us!

Many of our students still have unsupervised access to social media, chat rooms and inappropriate online content. This can affect their behaviour, focus and wellbeing at school every day.

With the new social media ban for children under 16 coming into effect on December 10, 2025, now is the time for families to act. Here's how you can help:

- Check accounts immediately – remove or deactivate any social media accounts for children under 16.
- Set strict device rules - no unsupervised use of phones, tablets or computers.
- Talk openly with your child - explain why safe online behaviour matters and the risks of inappropriate content.
- Promote offline activities - reading, hobbies, outdoor play and face-to-face socialising.
- Model responsible use - children learn digital habits by watching adults.

Taking action now protects our students' safety, supports their focus and learning at school, and sets them up for responsible, healthy technology use in the future.


