Communication with teachers

Sad news



Setting high expectations inside & outside the classroom

Throughout this year our staff will be continuing to implement our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) framework. This will include explicitly teaching our students the expected behaviours in different areas of our school. We will share with our community when we introduce new expectations which align with our school values. One of the first expectations for the year, has been the before school bag routine. I have been very impressed that after day one, all students know where to place their bags before playing in the mornings. As a result, this has made our play yard a safer and better organised place for students and parents, while also adding a consistent routine for our students. Classroom behaviour process

At GPS we aim to promote positive behaviour as much as possible. On ocassions, students may display behaviour that is not reflective of the teacher's expectations. The flow chart below shows the process that will occur in the classroom when required. If your child is regularly displaying off-task behaviour, your child's teacher will make contact with you. All students have been explicitly taught this process.

As we progress through the development of our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) we will update families of any changes in our processes.


School Council Election

A message from Mrs Rogers from the Art Studio




Any donations of colourful wool balls, beads, ribbons appreciated. If you have anything you wish to donate, please contact me to check if I have room for it and can use it.

Lunch Orders


